WISDOM

RIGHT JUDGMENT

With this gift (sometimes called piety) we have a deep sense of respect for God and the Church. A person with reverence recognizes our total reliance on God and comes before Him with humility, trust and love.

COURAGE

With this gift (sometimes called fear of the Lord) we are aware of the glory and majesty of God. A person with wonder and awe knows that God is the perfection of all we desire: Perfect knowledge, perfect goodness, perfect power and perfect love

REVERENCE

With this gift we understand the meaning of God's Revelation, especially as expressed in the life and words of Jesus Christ. A person with knowledge is always learning more about the Scriptures and Tradition.

WONDER AND AWE

With this gift we comprehend how we need to live as a follower of Jesus Christ. A person with understanding is not confused by all the conflicting messages in our culture about the right way to live.
